President's Message August 2022

OUR ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP IS DECLINING

Whilst there are many factors behind declining membership, some of the biggest factors that associations should factor into their retention strategies include financial uncertainty of members, changing membership needs and interests, and struggles to connect with new and younger members.

We are not alone. More than half of associations report that they are losing members. With competition from new groups and aging members, our association may find itself with an attrition problem.

Let's look at some solutions to declining membership. *Is our association still relevant?*

If U3A Clarence is changing or even being phased out, how much interest can our group have for our members? Although there are things you can't change, we can become proactive about making your association more meaningful. We could consider revising our mission statement, updating our activities or even merging with other U3As or Seniors groups.

Is there something driving members away?

This can be a particularly tough question to pose. In insular groups like ours, a fear of lingering COVID in the community, a lack of suitable presentations and activities may be responsible for membership losses. On a more positive note, it may be something that's easy to fix, like an overly complex website with too many popup windows or dues that are disproportionate to what the association offers compared to other competing organisations.

What do members want?

Associations often become mired in what the committees want at the expense of the larger membership. Is it time to conduct a detailed survey of our members to see if we've drifted away from why they joined in the first place?

HOW. TO. ENROL

We prefer that you do this online. These are the instructions for online enrolment.

Online enrolment:

- 1. Search for U3A Clarence.
- 2. Click on the first website: U3A Clarence
- 3. Click on UMAS the button.
- 4. Click on Login
- 5. Enter your member number and password
- 6. Click on **View or Select Courses** on menu on the left. Courses for term 3 2022 will all have a course code starting with 223. You may need to scroll through the term 2 courses to find the term 3 ones.
- 7. Check the box on the left-hand side for each course you want to enrol in.
- 8. Courses which are highlighted in blue are full. You can still check the box, but you will be placed on a waiting list.
- 9. Click on the Confirm Selections button at the bottom of the list of courses.
- 10. The list of courses you have selected will appear. The fourth column is the **Status**. This will be blank if you have been included in the course, and will have **Wait listed** if the course is full.
- 11. Click on the Finalise Courses ... button to finish your enrolment. This step is important so don't leave it out.
- 12. The information in step 10 is the information on your enrolment status. You will not receive any additional confirmation such as an email.
- 13. Once this has been finalised, your enrolment is complete.
- 14. Logout.
